The primary source of support for the organization's activities will be receipts from the Annual Conference which the organization will sponsor. Secondary sources of funds will be other, smaller social/cultural events and dues from the membership. It is anticipated that some foundation support will be solicited, though no specific plans for that fundraising have been made.

The fundraising program will consist of sponsoring an Annual Conference, which will also be the major expense of the organization each year. In addition, a dues schedule will be adopted and other, smaller events will be promoted which should bring in approximately 10-20% of the annual budget. The first such Annual Conference which the organization will sponsor will take place in October, 1982. This Conference is not intended primarily as a fundraising event, but as an educational activity in furtherance of the purposes of the organization.

Other workshops will be held to discuss current U.S. foreign policy goals and problems; will conduct orientation programs for recently-returned former volunteers and for prospective volunteers; and will conduct outreach to other organizations with similar goals.

The other events which the organization will promote during the rest of the year have not yet been planned, as the Annual Conference is taking up all the time of the members.
